





Support for landmine removal



Landmine removal is an important issue for Ukraine's post-war reconstruction. JICA's more than 20 years of expertise in providing equipment and technical assistance in Cambodia and Japan's cutting-edge technology to detect landmines quickly and efficiently are contributing to the safety of the Ukrainian people.

Support for the cultural and artistic revival



Many museums, theaters and historical buildings are currently being destroyed, causing significant damage in Ukraine. Japan is working through an international organization to support the protection and restoration of cultural heritage. Japan has also been providing equipment and assistance through the framework of the Grant Assistance for Cultural Grassroots Projects, one of which is the support provided to the National Opera & Ballet Theatre of Ukraine. Many donations from Japanese ballet fans are being sent to this theater.

Support in establishing a disaster medical system



Ukraine faces the issue of providing adequate medical care in these times of difficulty. The Japanese government invited Ukrainian medical officials to Japan to provide DMAT (Disaster Medical Assistance Team) expertise as part of its support. Japan is contributing to Ukraine's recovery by leveraging its unique experience in disaster recovery.
